In turn, she was part of the deal team that led to the successful sale of the publicly traded firm to a private equity-owned firm, where she remained and headed the financial services practice. In this role, she led a team of over 1,600 people domestically and internationally to provide advisory and managed services to global commercial and government clients. In 2021, Ellen opened an operation in Lithuania that now has over 300 employees.
